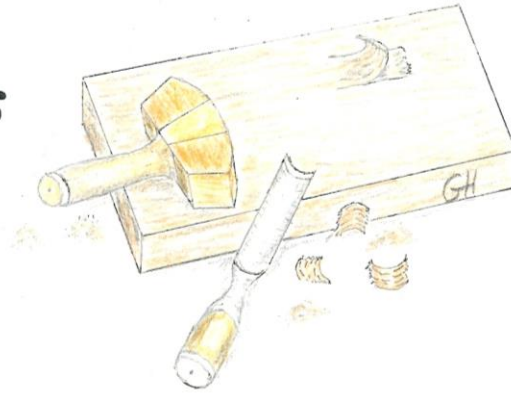

CLUB BUSINESS

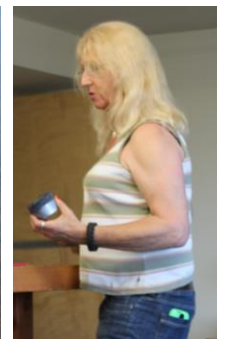
Election of officers and Board of Directors was conducted. Because nobody new was interested and those already in office were willing, Reelection was by acclamation.

SHOW AND TELL

Rachael Boyd showed us a method for oiling the steel parts of our tools.

Jon Cash Brought in a mailbox and two magazines that he offered to anybody who wanted them. He also continued the Round Table from last month by talking about shims versus wedges for a minute or two. He also talked about a foxed mortice and tenon joint. Basically the mortice has a flared out bottom and the tenon is split and a wedge is driven into the split tenon as it is seated. Care must be used because there is no way to get this apart.



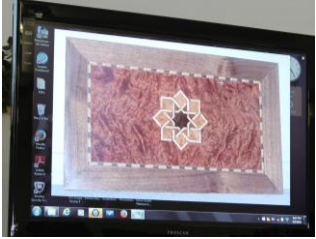


Jon Fager brought in two boxes for children to learn the handling of money. He used maple and walnut. Each section is marked, Save – Give – Spend.



ROUND TABLE – Presented by Hershel Lester

Sand Shading – is a method of changing the color of wood veneer by the use of heat. You need tools to handle the hot wood and moving the hot sand. The tools that Hershel uses are a veneer saw, tweezers, a spoon, a razor knife, and some chisels. You also need a heat source, in this case a hot plate to govern the temperature and an accurate thermometer, the best you can find. You also need a steel pan for holding the sand and the veneer. The sand is extremely fine grained. The temperatures are in the 400 degree range. The color of the veneer may take a while to start changing color but then it can change rapidly. Thanks, Hershel, this was well presented and very interesting.



I happened to run into a club member the Monday after our meeting and he was as enthusiastic as I was about our last meeting. We may have had only eleven members present but we had a really good meeting.
