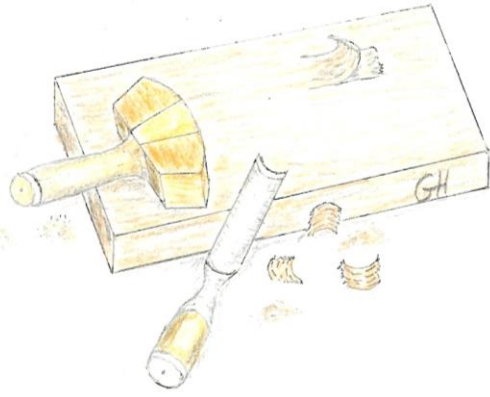


# Peninsula Woodworkers Club

Table Saw Cove Cutting The table saw blade can be adjusted for cutting the depth and width of the cove as well as setting the shape of the cove. Let your imagination go to work for you.
