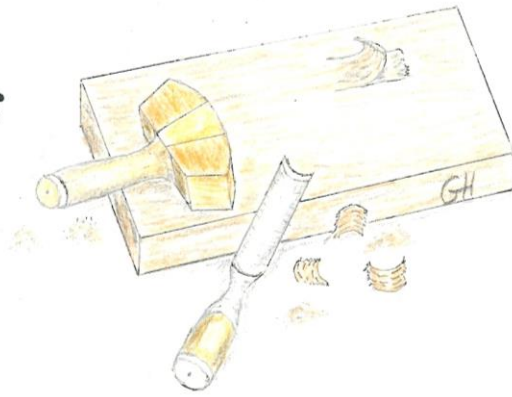


Peninsula Woodworkers Club

The attendance drawing will be held at the January meeting.

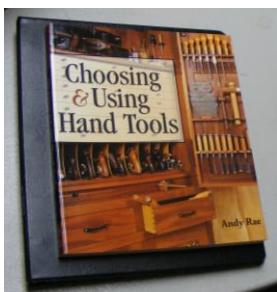
