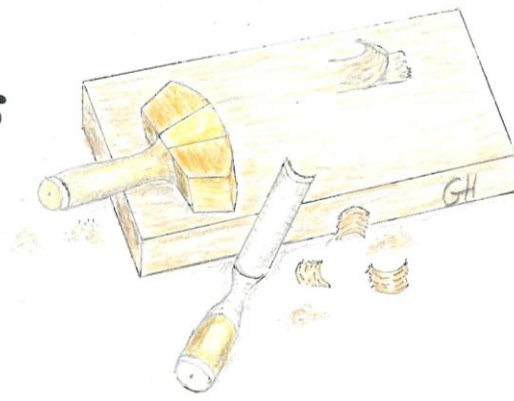


Peninsula Woodworkers Club

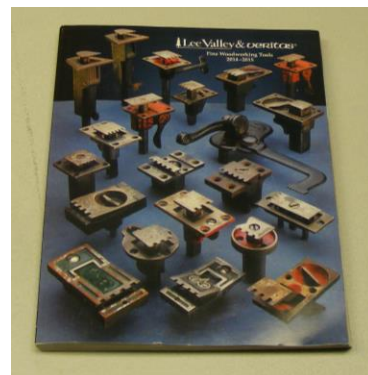

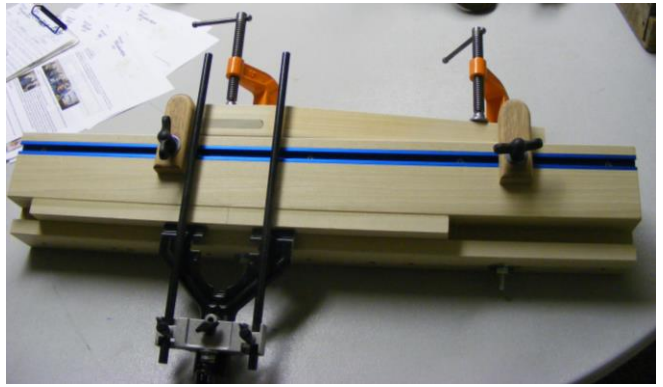
The request for fret saw info came up, and how to use it.

Jon Cash brought in Lee Valley & Veritas catalog.



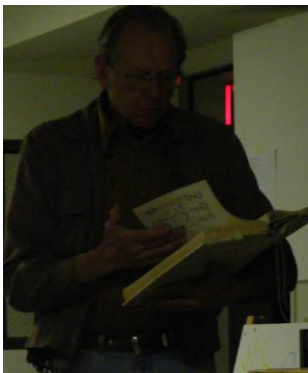

The knob on the lid was a piece of Alaska moose antler. He had to get some assistance from John Elliott for turning the lid.



Jeff Considine showed us a serving tray. The bottom piece is called Dutch metal, which is gilded and patinated. There is quite an involved chemical process. The results are quite pretty antiquing.

We also talked about removing the crown from a crooked board. Simply attach the board to a straight board and run the pair against the rip fence of a table saw and square up the offender.
