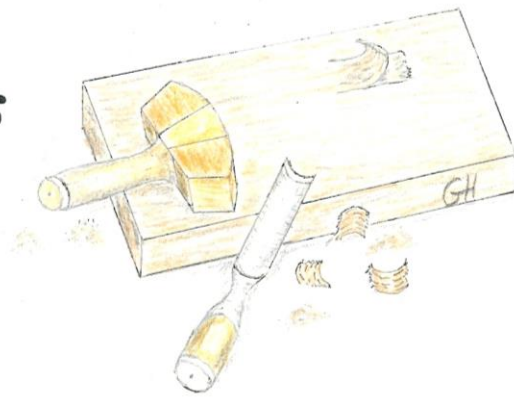


Peninsula Woodworkers Club

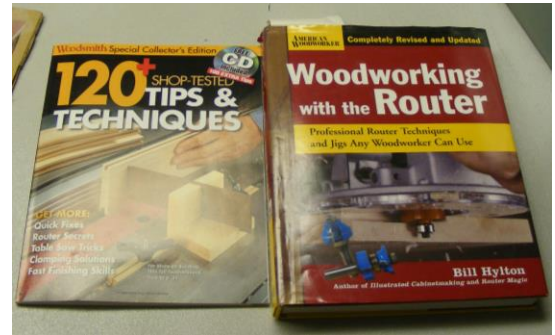
