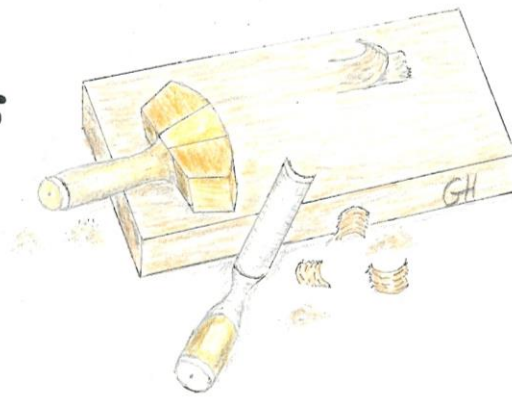


# Peninsula Woodworkers Club

## CLUB BUSINESS

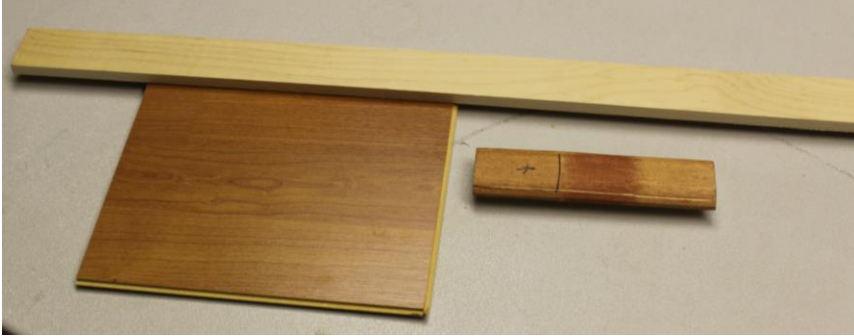
Jeff Considine won the member attendance drawing. Congratulations, Jeff.

SHOW AND TELL

Jon Fager dyed some maple transition strips at several doorways.



Mike Kurhajetz brought in three Diston saws, two of which, the backsaws, have seen better days but which can be restored. The other saw is a combination of ripping and crosscutting features. This saw has been sharpened so many times the cutting edge, as the photo shows, has receded to the Diston etching on the blade. The handle is designed to be held with both hands when used for ripping. The dimensions of the steel blade billet make it unusual. The thickest part is the cutting edge at the handle and it tapers in thickness to the blade tip. The blade thickness also is thinner at the noncutting edge.



Jake Tiemersma brought in a couple of rings he made using hole saws. They were pieces of flooring he had acquired along the way. We were unable to identify the species.



Tom Howell had some questions about the best way to install some storage under his new stairwell. He showed us some photos



Jon Cash showed us a devise for cutting stock on the table saw without having to set up the miter gage. Just place the guide against the rip fence on top of the stock.

Jon Cash did a presentation on how to do compound angles without having to be a mathematician. As a slight aside I am working on a project which involves making compound angles.
