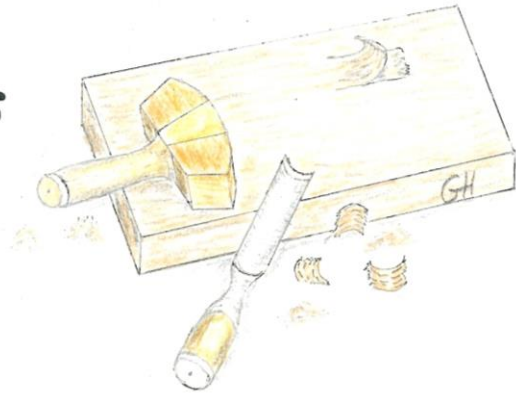


Peninsula Woodworkers Club

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

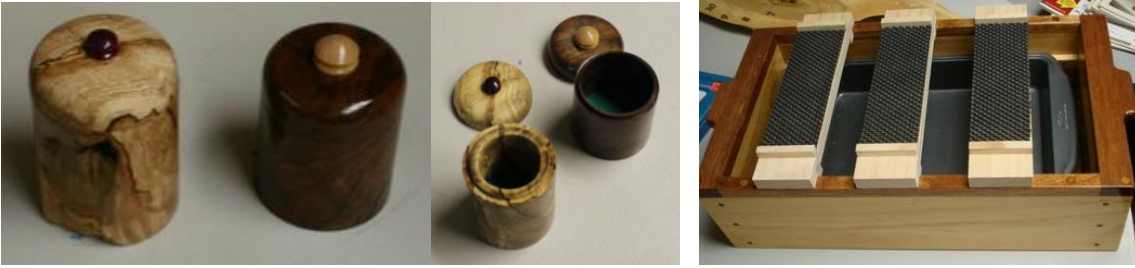
