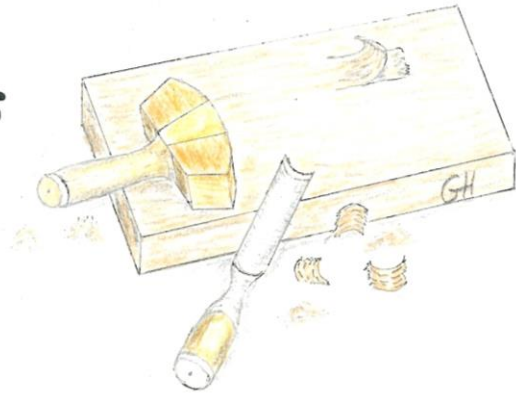


# Peninsula Woodworkers Club
