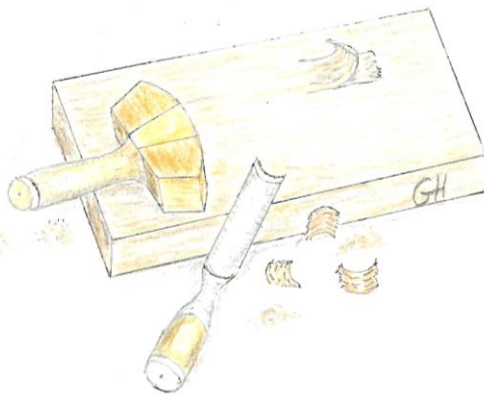


Peninsula Woodworkers Club

ATTENDANCE DRAWING

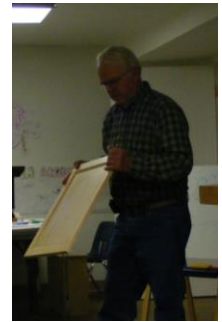
Dick Boyd won a gift card for gift card for Klingspors Woodworking Shop.

SHOW AND TELL

We had a short discussion about the best angle for dovetail joints. The consensus seemed to me to be whatever pleases the eye of the woodworker. Some woodworkers have a hard and fast angle in mind with a sharper angle for softwoods.

Jon Fager showed cabinet doors and a unique tile backsplash tile pattern (vertical accent strips). He also talked about a newer version of SKETCH-UP with tutorials.

ROUND TABLE



Rachael led the Round Table with a discussion about milk paint and chalk paint. These are paints which have been around for a looong time and yield a "vintage" look. Milk paint is pricey while chalk paint is economical. Milk paint takes more surface preparation. Chalk paint presents a suitable surface with the second coat. I Googled milk and chalk paint and asked for the differences. I was shifted over to YouTube and found an abundance of video information.

We're still looking for a shop visit.
